#### **COVID-19 UPDATE**

Town Hall is open to the public from 9 am - 4 pmMonday to Friday. Access to Town Hall is being administered through a door buzzer and intercom system. Access to the building is limited to a maximum of 2 customers at one time. It is mandatory to wear a mask to enter the building.



## **CAPITAL WORKS**



•Gallagher Lake Siphon - Actively under construction with H&M Excavating Ltd as the prime contractor. The anticipated completion date is April 2022.

•Station Street – This project is currently in the design process and will be tendered this spring with hopes of construction to start in the summer. This will incorporate some storm water, water and sewer upgrades.

•**Fairview Bridge** – The Town has been working with Associated Engineering and it currently is in the tendering process until April 15<sup>th</sup>. Works are anticipated to begin this summer but to be determined once a contractor is hired. This will involve surface (deck) and under deck girder.

•Airport North End Runway Expansion - Grant funding has been secured to extend the runway for 36 metres on the north end of the Airport. This project was tendered, with Mike Johnson Excavating Ltd awarded the contract, work will soon start.

•Town Hall Siding Replacement - Currently underway, this will refresh the building with new shakes siding, trim and paint.

Did you know that a property owner needs approval to add or change a driveway?

Why? The proximity of a driveway cannot be close to a corner, pole, or traffic sign and the grade of a driveway can affect storm water runoff. Minimum and maximum width also apply.

Property taxes for 2021 are scheduled for mail out in mid May and are due July 2, 2021. Any unpaid balances (including unclaimed Home Owner Grants) after July 2nd will have a five percent (5%) penalty applied on July 3rd and a five percent (5%) penalty applied on September 1st.
