MAKE WATER WORK SMARTER IN **YOUR YARD**

- Water between dusk and dawn. Putting water to work during the coolest part of the day prevents evaporation. A good rule of thumb is to water between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- Get a timer! Most hardware stores supply timers for sprinklers. Sleep like a baby while your water works the night shift.
- Sprinkle your lawn or garden, not your pavement. Don't let water waste your time, effort and money!
- Okanagan water works best with plants suitable for our dry climate. Plant droughttolerant turf, native and low-water plants.
- **Leave grass 2 − 3 inches tall (5-8cm)**. Water stays longer when grass is longer.
- Collect and use rainwater. It's free!
- One inch a week of water will do! Most lawns need just 2.5cm (one inch) of water per week about the depth of a tuna can.

LATE IRRIGATION

Late irrigation is available for those customers who require irrigation water beyond the October irrigation shut down date set by Council.

Late irrigation is charged per acre / per day. The late irrigation rate for 2023 is \$1.95 / acre / day.

PUNCTUREVINE

HABITAT

In British Columbia, puncturevine occurs only in the Okanagan Valley, as far north as Vernon and in the lower Similkameen Valley. It prefers sandy or well-drained soils and readily invades disturbed ground. Puncturevine typically infests vacant lots, gravel parking areas, roadsides, unpaved trails, and beaches.

IMPACT & RISKS

 Stiff spines on the fruit readily attach to footwear, clothing, animals, tires, machinery, and supplies.
 They can injure the feet, hides, mouths, eyes, and digestive tracts of livestock.

PREVENTION & MITIGATION

- Monitor your property regularly.
- Reduce the amount of bare ground to minimize soil disturbances.
- Re-seed or plant disturbed soils.
- Remove plants before they produce seeds.

TREATMENT & DISPOSAL

- Hand removal or hoeing is effective for controlling small outbreaks.
- Shallow tilling (~2.5 cm deep) of young plants can be effective in larger areas.
- Mowing is not an effective method of control.
- Mulch applied prior to germination or when plants are small can effectively suppress outbreaks but it needs to be at least 7-8 cm thick.

FIRESMART YOUR HOME

Is your home in a wildfire environment? From cleaning your roof, gutter and trimming any branches over hanging onto your roof, to moving firewood and propane 10-30 meters away from your home, there are surprisingly easy steps you can take to make your home FireSmart! Here are some more tips:

- Do a self assessment of your home.
- Remove combustible materials from under decks.
 Keep a 1.5-meter non-combustible zone around the house and deck.
- Clean and maintain gutters and roofs. Keep decks and balconies clear of leaves and debris.
- Keep grass and weeds cut below 10cm.
- Plant wildfire resistant vegetation.
- Prune trees to create a 2-meter clearance from the ground.
- Ensure you have a wildfire evacuation plan in your household.
