## **STARTING WEEK OF APRIL 7**

Changes to the solid waste collection program are coming soon! We would like to extend our thanks to everyone in the community who has participated in the engagement activities and shared valuable feedback over the past eight months to help shape this new program.

**Starting the week of Monday, April 7, 2025**, organic waste, such as food scraps, will no longer be accepted in the black lid cart. Instead, it will be collected weekly in your green lid cart.

To help you prepare for this transition, the **new waste collection schedule** for April-December 2025 is now available, along with a list of items that will and will not be accepted in the green lid carts starting April 7, 2025.

## **INVASIVE SPECIES FOCUS – TREE OF HEAVEN**



**Tree of Heaven** is a significant invasive species in many parts of the world. Native to Asia, it was introduced to British Columbia as an urban tree known for its fast growth and tolerating a wide range of growing conditions. Tree of heaven has multiple modes of reproduction, allowing it to spread prolifically.

Its aggressive root system can cause damage to our urban infrastructure. It's capable of breaking through asphalt and cracking through building foundations, walls or even sewers. When Tree of Heaven colonizes an environment, it will outcompete native flora and create a monoculture ecosystem.

### How can I deal with Tree of Heaven?

- Pulling or digging up young saplings can be effective as long as the entire plant, roots and fragments are removed to prevent regrowth. Cutting alone won't be effective due to its aggressive suckering ability. However, repeated cutting can potentially exhaust root reserves.
- The area should then be monitored to remove any new seedlings or roots that appear.
- Cutting isn't an effective method of removal since it will respond by growing stump sprouts and root suckers.
- Maintaining a healthy native plant community can prevent Tree of heaven from invading an area. Leaving native plants in place or revegetating a bare area with native plants reduces the opportunity for Tree of Heaven to establish.
- Resulting waste should be bagged and disposed of at the landfill to prevent any accidental spread.
